Brass Pacifica was founded in 1995 by five of Los Angeles' most accomplished young brass players. The musicians were drawn together by a desire to make extraordinary music and to be stimulated by the musicianship of other fine players. Since the ensemble's inception, the members have dedicated themselves to the study and performance of chamber music. Brass Pacifica has had the great opportunity to work with world renowned artists such as the Canadian Brass, Atlantic Brass,

St. Louis Brass, American Brass, and the Empire Brass Quintet.

Most recently, Brass Pacifica concluded an extensive residency with the Grand Theatre in Ellsworth, Maine. This program was funded by both Chamber Music America and the National Endowment for the Arts. For nine months, Brass Pacifica worked extensively with educational outreach programs in the local rural community while taking every opportunity to perform formal events, including live concerts at both the University of Maine and Boston University. In March 2001, Brass Pacifica was awarded Grand Prize at the Georgia International Brass Quintet Competition and received an invitation to the 2002

World Brass Quintet Competition in Narbonne, France.

Brass Pacifica continues to strive for the very best in music performance and education, booking over 100 performances per year all over Southern California.
